To appreciate the full appeal of this car, we recommend popping the hood to take in the breathtaking engine compartment and chassis. Typical of factory show cars, nearly all components have been polished, chromed, and detailed. Even better, the 250SE drives just as beautiful as it looks. Tight, responsive handling means it's a joy to tool around in, but don't just take it from us — make this car yours and experience it for yourself.



DID YOU KNOW?

Both the Mercedes 250SE and the 300SE have almost the exact same 0-60 times, as well as top speed. This can be attributed to the fact that the 15 additional horsepower of the 300 off-sets the additional weight from the suspension and other components.

General Vetter sells the 250SE to Charles F. Stuchik III of Milton, DE

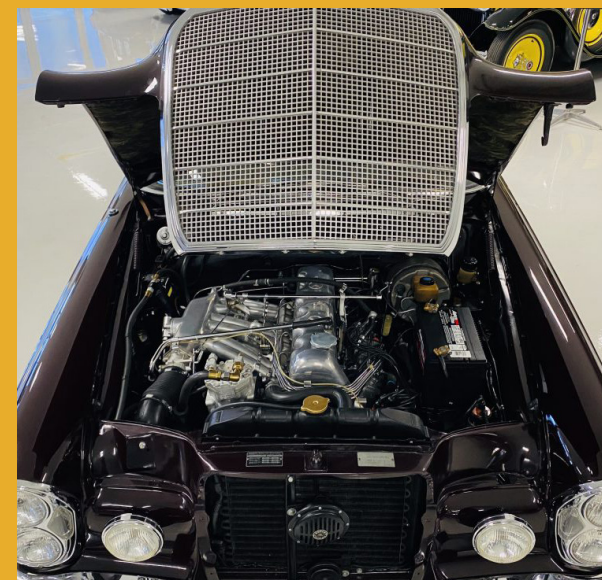
