Complying with your request, we are sending you herewith coachbuilder's blue prints, A-13338 of our standard chassis, and A-13647 a supplementary blue print covering the details of the so-called 150" wheel base. This drawing takes care of the dimensions wherein they differ from our standard chassis.

Just an explanation about the wheel base: Rolls-Royce has recently changed the location of their front axle so that the wheel base is now only 148½", but the body space is exactly the same as it was on the 150" wheel base.

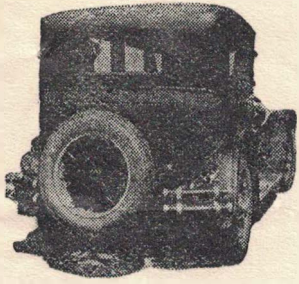

Mr. Fahnestock said he would give me the chance to figure on his requirements for the special body on the 150" wheel base which he has verbally ordered today. He is getting figures from other builders and if our price is favorable he will then show me the design which he has selected and ask for sketches, so naturally the price should be as reasonable as we can make it. Over the telephone he gave me the following details:

- The body is to be an all weather stationary top Cabriolet.
- The curtain over the chauffeur will probably be made shifting, although he was not certain on this point.
- Windows to roll up alongside of driver.
- One extra seat with folding back concealed against partition with the division windows probably sliding.
- Non-shatterable glass throughout.
- Gray and tan upholstery.
- Chauffeur's seat covered in leather with the driver's cushion and back with a cloth slip.
- Interior mountings probably nickel or embossed to match upholstery, perhaps special fittings like old car which had ivory fittings.
- Dropping arm rest for rear seat.
- Vanity case and smoker's box.
- Electric dome light and in corners and step lights.
- Robe bar.
- Foot rest.
- Lolling holders.
- Painting to be selected, lacquer or hand brushed.
- Special trunk at rear for three suit cases.
- Time required.

The other day Mr. Jenks told me a representative of Locke & Co. body builders was at the factory getting measurements of chassis for body and from his remarks I would gather that the factory is not giving him a 150" wheel base, which is the measurement between the wheel centres which he contracted for.

You will remember, we had quite a time selling him this measurement as he wanted a specially long chassis, the same length as the old one, which measured 151 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".
